Best Practise

"Adoption of Village for Holistic Development through NSS"

This practice works for overall development of villagers. This practice is implemented with the help of NSS Volunteers, the college students and staff. Through this practice various problems of adopted villagers are solved.

Goals:

- To try to identify and solve the various problems of the village
- To inform villagers about various government schemes and make awareness among them to apply for it.

Context

Institution has a good number of faculties and professional activities for the villagers. The college has led teachers and students from rural areas to stimulate their ideas and put them in the practice on experimental base. Students, teachers and non-teaching staff contribute to make the scheme successful as social duty. With the help of survey our college selected a village to adopt and communicated with the senior citizens of village.

Practice

The college students works for the welfare and development of the village. They participate in the various activities and programmes in adopted village
